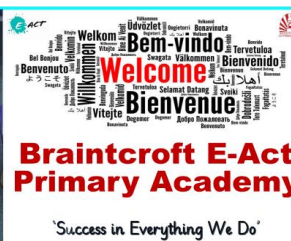
STARS OF THE WEEK

WAYS TO SUPPORT YOUR CHILD'S LEARNING AT SCHOOL

- 1. Encourage independence:** From Reception onwards, children are expected to know the basics of looking after themselves. Encourage your child to be independent, dress on their own – tackling buttons, zips and taking off and putting on jackets. Read and research on their own in higher year groups.
- 2. Help them learn about making friends:** Having friends is hugely beneficial for children. This helps with socialising, so do encourage your child to talk to other children at play time or at the park
- 3. Develop speaking and listening skills:** School children are expected to listen to what the teacher says, without interrupting, and to also answer when spoken to. Get your child ready for talking by encouraging family discussions at the dinner table, taking turns to listen and to speak.
- 4. Encourage your child to read and do homework.:** Some children will already be able to read and write simple words by the time they start Reception; others will be exploring new books and learning at school. Please encourage them at home to read daily or do homework.
- 5. Talk enthusiastically about school:** Children's thoughts about school can vary enormously. Some children are always happy to come to school while some find it stressful to leave their parents or homes. Talk enthusiastically and positively about school and teachers. Visit the school and see the wonderful things that are happening to have a positive outlook about school.

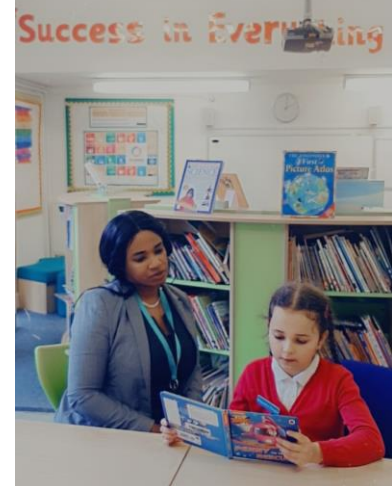
We are indeed one family-I had my gingerbread as promised with a lovely family after school! Team Spirit!
