## Attendance and Punctuality

Attendance and Punctuality was one of the main areas questioned by the Ofsted inspectors. It was seen that some parents took pupils out of school and out of the country which were not authorised. Our attendance will affect our Ofsted grading, which is one of the reasons we cannot announce results to parents as yet. This was the most negative conversation throughout the whole inspection.

This year, families will be reported and/charged £120 for unauthorised absences in instances. Attendance Officers and senior leaders will be visiting homes of some parents who call in saying pupils are sick. PLEASE BOOK APPOINTMENTS IN MORNINGS or EVENINGS so that pupils can still attend school during an appointment day, for pupils not to be being fully absent on the day.

Punctuality to school is also important. We open our gates at 8:30am and will close them at 8:45 when lessons begin. Pupils should be seated in their classes, and ready to learn before 8:45. Inspectors noted that too many children arrived after 8:45 and that also need to improve.

This Wednesday 21<sup>st</sup> of September is our Student Election Day where pupils will be voting for Head Boy, Head Girl, House Captains and other Leadership positions in the school.



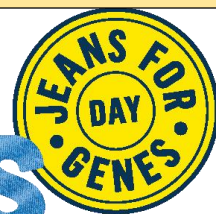
