VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN AND GIRLS DAY!

Violence against women and girls (VAWG) covers a range of unacceptable and deeply distressing crimes, including rape and other sexual offences, stalking, domestic abuse, 'honour'-based abuse (including female genital mutilation, forced marriage and 'honour' killings), 'revenge porn' and 'upskirting', as well as many others. These crimes disproportionately affect women and girls. However, men and boys can also be victims of violence and abuse. Children become victims of domestic abuse in their own right where they see, hear or experience the effects of domestic abuse.

In assemblies, and in lessons our children are taught to recognise violence and domestic abuse against women, men and children.
