**KS2 SATs will take place between Tuesday 9th May 2023 – Friday 12th May 2023. Over this period pupils will sit 6 different tests, with English normally taking place at the beginning of the week and maths at the end.** We will provide **FREE BREAKFAST** for all Year 6 pupils during their SATs week. Please ensure that they are all at school for 8:00 am breakfast. Year 6 SATs results are used to measure both the school and each child's progress and achievements in maths, spelling, punctuation & grammar, plus reading. The results show the progress between Year 2 and Year 6, which is really important to show what children have learnt in English and Maths.
