#### **Unauthorised Absences**

Unauthorised absences are any absence not agreed by your child's school. If your child has unauthorised absences in an academic year, you may be liable for a penalty notice.

Unfortunately, at this time of the year the Headteacher receives numerous requests for pupils to leave school during school time for various reasons. One of the major underlying reasons for absences in June and July is, parents book cheaper tickets to travel abroad, with many fabricating similar stories about sickness of family members abroad. Often when investigated, these arguments are untrue.

Everyone would like a cheaper holiday, even teachers, but by law, pupils and teachers are expected to be at school up until the last day.

Please do not book tickets for children to leave school before the 20<sup>th</sup> July 2023. We teach our children about integrity and it should be practised at home as well as in school. We cannot physically stop you as adults from doing whatever you wish to do but you have a legal obligation to ensure your child attends school every day.
