Dear Parents, Carers, and Students,

We are happy to share that we had a **School Review from E-Act** Executive Leaders on Tuesday and it was quite positive. This is one year from our most recent Good Ofsted results.

Another good thing to report about is our **ATTENDANCE** this week, which is climbing steadily towards our 97% target. We were at 95% attendance on Friday, which was above many schools in England for the week.

However, we have some pupils still absent from school for various reasons. Please remember we are expecting everyone at school every day at the gate from 8:30am.

## OUR CHILDREN ARE ENJOYING THEIR LEARNING!

I have had the pleasure of listening to pupils from different year groups speak about their learning experiences so far, and I am proud to say they are enjoying their lessons at school. Please speak to the children about books they are reading, maths they are doing, writing, phonics, or even what they do during their playtime to capture some of their school experiences.

## SUPPORTING PUPILS WITH SPECIAL EDUCATIONAL NEEDS (SEND)

As a school, one of our main aim is to provide a safe and **inclusive learning environment** for all our pupils. However, supporting children with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND) can be both rewarding and challenging for parents and teachers. It's important to understand that children with SEND may have unique learning, social, emotional, or physical needs that require much additional support in some circumstances.

Many of our parents are aware of the challenges while others may find it challenging to understand and come to terms with their child's diagnosis or disabilities. It takes time to learn about the specific challenges their child faces and how best to support them in their daily lives.

Each child with SEND has their own specific needs, which can vary greatly across different age groups. This means that teachers try their best to provide personalised support tailored to the children's abilities and challenges. Supporting a child with SEND can bring about emotional challenges for parents. They may experience feelings of stress, worry, guilt, or frustration as they navigate the ups and downs of their child's development and progress.
